

COTTON SHEEP

Our soft and cuddly cotton ball sheep is a fun, fuzzy, farm craft that is perfect for preschoolers. Kids will enjoy experiencing the texture of the cotton balls as they create their own flock of cottony critters all by themselves. This craft also works well with popped popcorn, mini marshmallows, or even dried macaroni noodles painted white!

SUPPLY LIST:

- Cotton balls
- Paper towel roll
- Black pompoms (in assorted sizes)
- Google eyes
- Glue
- Scissors



INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Take the paper towel roll and cut it to the size you want the length of the sheep to be (i.e., 1/3 of the roll).
2. Cut slits about 1cm deep into the two ends, and bend/fold the roll in on itself to cover the holes.
3. Dot a spot of glue on the roll and place a cotton ball on it, repeat until the entire tube is covered (leaving a spot uncovered in the front for the head).
4. Take 4 equal sized black pompoms and place them on the bottom of your sheep to create legs.
5. Take a larger black pompom along with 2 smaller pompoms (which is where the eyes will be located) and glue them together to create the head.
6. Glue the google eyes on to the smaller black pompoms.
7. Glue a smaller black pompom to the back as a fluffy tail!
8. If you are feeling adventurous, you can choose to give it a haircut, trimming it with scissors to sheer back some of the fluff!
