SNOWMAN PUPPET

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Completely unfold your paper bag, so that it can stand up on its own and has a flat top. Place a piece of paper towel underneath the bag to catch any messes. Begin painting the entire bag white. You may need to do a few coats. If so, you'll need to be patient and let the paint dry between coats!
2. While you're waiting for the paint to dry, begin cutting shapes out of construction paper to decorate the front of your snowman. Cut out an orange triangle for a carrot nose, or circles for buttons.
3. Once your bag is painted and dry, lie it flat. Now it is time to decorate the front of your snowman! Use white glue to attach your construction paper shapes to the paper bag. Don't forget to give your snowman eyes.
4. Use the washi tape to give your snowman an awesome scarf!
5. Stand your bag up again. Now it is time to attach earmuffs. Using the white glue, attach a pom pom to either side of the snowman's head. Bend your pipe cleaner so that it is a semi-circle. Using the white glue, attach each end of the pipe cleaner to the paper bag right above the pom poms.
6. Wait for your snowman to dry. Once it is, put your hand inside, and begin creating your own winter stories!

ADDITIONAL TIPS

- Create multiple snowmen to let the whole family join in on the story-telling fun!
